1. Butterfly Transect and Wider Countryside Recorders' Conference

Date & time: Saturday 17 February 2018, 10am to 3pm

Venue: Littleton Millennium Memorial Hall, Littleton

This popular conference is held once every three years, and will be of interest to anyone in Hampshire & Isle of Wight who is currently involved in, or would like to be involved, in Butterfly Transect recording and Wider Countryside Butterfly monitoring. The day will comprise a series of talks about aspects of transect recording, data submission, butterfly trends, and the use of transect data to guide site management to benefit butterflies (and moths).

The event is free, but you need to register in advance to confirm your place, due to the capacity of the venue, and for catering purposes.

2. Butterfly Identification Course (2018)

"Identification of Hampshire's butterflies and day-flying moths"

6 evening meetings (7.30-9.00p.m., 7 Feb – 14 March 2018)

Following the popularity of previous courses, Andy Barker will be running a butterfly identification course for beginners and those who wish to further their knowledge. The course will focus on identification features of butterflies and day-flying moths, but will also discuss habitat requirements and the status of each of Hampshire's butterflies. A brief introduction to those species not found in Hampshire will also be given. The aim is to inspire people to go out and enjoy, record, and raise awareness of our butterflies, moths and their habitats.

The course will run for six consecutive Wednesday evenings, 7.30-9.00p.m., commencing 7 February and ending 14 March 2018. It will take place at Shawford Village Hall, just south of Winchester, and close to Shawford railway station. The full course is priced at a modest **£20 per person**, but places are limited to a maximum of 20 people, and must be pre-booked by emailing Andy Barker (email: aj3barker@btinternet.com). Places will be allocated on a first come first served basis, so please book early. Once your place has been confirmed, you will then be asked to send a cheque made payable to "Butterfly Conservation Hampshire Branch".

3. Turn old stamps and coins
