### **Transect News**

A total of 179 butterfly transects were walked in Hampshire and Isle of Wight during 2022, comprising 172 full transects and seven single species transects. More than 200,000 butterflies were recorded on transect, and almost 3,000 moths. These are impressive tallies, reflecting the enthusiasm and dedication of our volunteers, so many thanks to all involved!

Full results and analysis will appear in the 2022 Annual Butterfly Report, which should be available from early April 2023, but if you'd like an early look at the data, a tabulation of 2022 trends for all butterfly species is available <a href="https://example.com/here-number-numbe

## Reserves & volunteering News

### Magdalen Hill Down and Yew Hill

The year started with a generous grant of £1,000 for new tools from the South Downs National Park. Armed with brand new loppers, saws and rakes, the Reserves Volunteer Team were straight in action clearing scrub, footpaths and letting light back into the

education area. The volunteers are continuing their impressive scrub clearance work each week at Magdalen Hill Down. The Livestock Lookers have also been amazing showing their dedication to checking on the animals in the worst of weather, breaking thick ice from the troughs when it's been freezing, enduring heavy rainstorms, helping me at the last minute. Each reserve comes with an awesome team of volunteers so thank you all!

**At Magdalen**, two new troughs are being installed with funding from the *Farming in Protected Landscapes* grant. There will be a new trough at the bottom of the Allotment field so we can graze each compartment separately. A second trough in Extension field will allow periodic grazing of the small remnant of chalk grassland that's hidden and tucked away at the bottom of the field. This is part of the transect route and permissive footpath.

**Yew Hill** has continued to be managed by volunteers who meet fortnightly clearing scrub and restoring the Southern Water meadow. Hampshire Conservation Volunteers are spending a weekend doing scrub clearance so I hope after this winter you can see much improvement.

**MHD** - meet and park at the top of the track from the stone masons next to the cemetery entrance off Alresford Road.

**YH** – Meet at the bottom of Old Kennel Lane roadside, junction with Mill Lane, Oliver's Battery.

#### **News**

The cycleway along the A31, next to Magdalen Hill Down, has been re-routed through the scrape that was originally designed for the Striped Lychnis moth, and Small Blue butterfly. A chalk bank has been created from the spoil which will be managed for these species. It will allow better access and ensure the grassland verges and bank are managed appropriately. It has been entered into a five-year management plan in collaboration with the South Downs National Park. The second scrape (alongside Kings Lane) will be managed by the Magdalen Monday volunteer team.

### Request for help running moth traps

Are there any moth trappers out there who can spare time to run a moth trap at Magdalen Hill Down this summer? We would really like to keep records updated. Tony Davis from Butterfly Conservation has helped previously, but has too many commitments it would be hugely appreciated if someone could give their time and expertise to help with our moth records. ## Bentley Station Meadow Reserve update

The last volunteer session of the winter saw us able to complete clearing a clump of tangled bramble and thorn which has really opened up the North Meadow at the station end of the reserve. A great turnout boosted no doubt by the chance to meet Paul Tinsley-Marshall, South East Region Conservation Manager and to catch up with Pete Eeles, newly (re-)elected Branch Chair. Great networking went on as Alison and Sarah, two stalwarts of the recently created and rapidly evolving Blacknest Community Open Space, came to share ideas about linking-up with Bentley Station Meadow, using a network of forest rides. They will lead a guided walk that will take place on 18th May at 12.00 from Gravel Hill car park SU 80204332. Keep an eye out for full details, soon to be published on the Alton Walking Festival website. It is hoped that this will become a waymarked route in time.



After lunch, while the bonfire died down (see above), some of us hunted for Brown Hairstreak eggs - not as many as last year's survey, but good to know they were breeding here again last summer.

This was also the final volunteer task that I will be leading at Bentley, as I have a new job involving a move to Warwickshire, where I will be helping to look after a small nature reserve - which, you will be glad to hear, already has an established butterfly transect! I'm sure my 18 months in the role of Volunteer Reserve Officer gave me the opportunity to see that bit more of the behind the scenes goings on in a conservation organisation, which allowed me to secure this role. I can recommend the role to anyone keen on learning more about caring for natural spaces.

A great big thank you to all volunteers, past and present, who have made my time with Butterfly Conservation a memorable experience.
